Student concerns remain unanswered after assembly

On December 2nd, the senior class of El Rancho met with the newly appointed superintendent of the El Rancho Unified School District, Dr. Frances Esparza. The meeting was held to discuss alternative sites for the graduation ceremony this year.

Even after the meeting with Esparza, the senior class was not on the same page with the superintendent, which defeated the purpose of the meeting in the first place.

Rio Hondo College, as well as Whittier College, were discussed at the meeting as possible locations for the graduation ceremony.

These graduation sites are a lot nicer than the Don Memorial stadium, and are certainly better than Pioneer High School, the initial site for the graduation ceremony.

The meeting was a complete commotion, and a civil

conversation did not take place between Esparza and the seniors because the class of 2020 wants to graduate in the Don Memorial stadium.

It was stated early in the meeting that El Rancho would not be a possible graduation site due to the construction agenda, and that the cost for postponing the graduation ceremony until af-

ter graduation would be too high.

Although the alternative graduation sites, such as Rio Hondo College, seem tempting due to the larger seating arrangement, it is unjust that only this year's seniors have to graduate somewhere else.

Esparza was presented with a proposition by senior student Angel Marquez in order to make

up for the fact that the Don Memorial Stadium is not an option for graduation, which included the district covering the costs of grad night and prom for all seniors.

The proposition was taken into consideration by Esparza, and was set to be discussed by the school board as a possible compromise. However, in past board meetings the

Throughout the meeting, Esparza was also not able to answer questions as to why the construction agenda was scheduled the way it is because she has only been superintendent for a matter of months.

Many questions with regards to the demolition of the B building at the front of the school were also not answered by Esparza due to her lack of knowledge of the matter.

If the superintendent has no knowledge of certain things in relation, then someone who has been a part of the construction graduation plan should have accompanied Esparza in order to give the students the full information.



COFFEE CAKE

Yield: 15 By Anthony Somoza

Ingredients:

-2 cups all-purpose flour	-¾ cup milk, or as needed
-¾ cup white sugar	-1 ½ teaspoons vanilla extract
-2 teaspoons baking powder	-¼ cup all-purpose flour
-½ teaspoon salt	-2/3 cup white sugar
-½ cup butter	-1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
-1 egg	-¼ cup butter

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease and flour a 9x13 inch pan. Make the streusel topping: In a medium bowl, combine ¼ cup flour, ¾ cup sugar and 1 teaspoon cinnamon. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Set aside.

In a large bowl, combine 2 cups flour, ¾ cup sugar, baking powder and salt. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Crack an egg into a measuring cup and then fill add milk to make 1 cup. Stir in vanilla. Pour into crumb mixture and mix just until moistened. Spread into prepared pans. Sprinkle top with streusel.

Bake in the oven for 25 to 30 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake comes out clean. Allow to cool.



Harry Styles's *Fine Line* is more than just fine

No male artists in the music industry today are on par with Harry Styles, and with his sophomore album *Fine Line*, he proves it. Fans immediately connected it back to the singer when they noticed the acronym "TPWK" written underneath, which stands for "Treat People With Kindness"- a

message Styles is known for.

Shortly after, Styles released the lead single "Lights Up." He went on to make multiple announcements like a new tour and a celebration show at The Forum the day of the release; and promoting the album in various forms such as doing double duty on Saturday Night Live.

Styles even created the fictional island of Eroda to promote one of the songs featured on the album called "Adore You."

The upbeat pop song, "Lights Up," took many fans by surprise because it was completely different from his first album's lead single, "Sign of the Times," a five minute and forty second rock ballad.

"Shine, step into the light. Shine, so bright sometimes," sings Styles, "Shine, I'm not ever going back."

During an interview with Capital FM, Styles explained the meaning of "Lights Up," and said it was about freedom, self-reflection, and self-discovery.

Throughout the album, you'll find a few other songs about self-reflection and self-discovery; however, you'll also find songs about being in love, heartbreak, and the *fine line* between both.

The album has 12 tracks

and lasts 46 minutes. The first song on the album is called "Golden." It's easily one of my favorites from the album.

It's the type of song you would play as you're driving down by the beach with your hands out the window feeling the summer breeze or the type of song when you're just having the time of your life.

Though it's not confirmed if it was intentional or not, in "Golden," Styles wrote what

seems to be a continuation to one of the lyrics in "Ever Since New York," a song from his self-titled album. In "Ever Since New York," Styles sings, "There's no antidote for this curse." In which,

he finishes off in "Golden" by singing, "Lovin' you's the antidote." A lyrical genius I'd say.

Up next on the album are "Watermelon Sugar," "Adore You," and "Lights Up." They gave fans a taste of what Styles' album was going to sound like, considering how they were released before all the other songs, or at least they thought it was.

Each song in *Fine Line* has its own personality. "Falling" and "Fine Line" are the more melancholy tracks. If you're looking for songs to cry to, these would definitely be the ones to listen to.

In "Falling," Styles "brings his agony to life." In an interview with Zane Lowe, Styles shared that he "had started to feel [himself] becoming someone [he] didn't want to be and that was really hard" for him. He also shared how he wrote the song in an impressive time of around 20 minutes.

"Fine Line" exhibits such a liberating tone that makes you reflect on your past, present, and future. It's quite the emotional song. "Cherry" falls under the same category tone wise, as it's about a break-up. In fact, at the end of the song, Styles features a voice note with his ex-girlfriend's voice.

The songs "To Be So Lonely" and "Canyon Moon" show that folk-esque sound. "She" is a total ten out of ten, and becomes eleven when the two-minute guitar solo by Styles' guitarist, Mitch Rowland, strikes.


The app has even taken a step toward creating Disney Plus originals like their streaming counterparts, Netflix and Hulu have done in recent years.
